COMMITTEE JURISDICTION AND OVERVIEW

The New York State Senate Standing Committee on Elections has legislative oversight responsibilities for issues concerning election security, voter registration, and State of Board Elections practices and procedures.

During the 2021 Legislative Session, 226 bills were referred to the Committee for its review. Of these bills, 49 were reported from the Committee. 26 were passed by the Senate, and 18 passed in both houses. This work was conducted through a series of four committee meetings. A list of all bills that were reported from the committee is provided at the end of this report.

In addition to its regular meetings, the Committee held five hearings. Topics of these hearings included collecting testimony from voters, poll workers, elections officials, advocates, and scholars following the results tabulation errors made by the New York City Board of Elections. These witnesses described their first-hand experiences as New York voters and the challenges they faced while doing their civic duty. In essence, many of these voters witnessed the structural flaws within our electoral system which disenfranchised people of color, low-income voters, voters with physical disabilities, or voters whose primary language is not English. The conclusion of the hearings led us to consider changes that would have the greatest impact on improving the system.
