COMMITTEE JURISDICTION AND OVERVIEW

The New York State Senate Standing Committee on Procurement and Contracts has legislative oversight responsibilities for issues concerning procurement and contracting actions including competitive bidding, procurement lobbying, preferred source, as well as minority and women owned business enterprises.

During the 2021 Legislative Session, fifty-nine (59) bills were referred to the Committee for its review. Of these bills, twenty (20) were reported directly from the Committee and five (5) were discharged to the Committee on Rules. Thirteen (13) were passed by the Senate, and seven (7) passed in both houses. This work was conducted through a series of four (4) committee meetings. A list of all bills that were reported from the committee is provided at the end of this report.

COMMITTEE HIGHLIGHTS

The following key bills were acted on by the committee in 2021:

- S370A (HOYLMAN) -- Requires certain state owned and operated parking garages, open parking lots and other parking facilities to install and maintain charging stations for plug-in electric vehicles
- S542A (KAMINSKY) -- Relates to provisions in state procurement contracts involving the use of low embodied carbon concrete
- S1215 (BENJAMIN) -- Relates to assisting contractors to identify minority group members and women for hiring opportunities
- S1826A (SKOUFIS) -- Requires software that blocks automated calls to be provided in state contracts that include information and communication technologies
- S3391 (BAILEY) -- Directs contracting state agencies to develop a growth plan in order to increase participation of MWBEs with respect to state contracts and subcontracts
- S3908A (KENNEDY) -- Relates to enacting the New York state buy American salt act
- S5921 (KRUEGER) Enacts the New York deforestation-free procurement act
- S6998 (REICHLIN-MELNICK) -- Relates to providing for discretionary buying thresholds

TWO HOUSE BILLS

In 2021, seven of the fifty-nine (59) bills referred to the Standing Committee on Procurement and Contracts passed both houses of the Legislature. The Governor has signed all of these bills into law.
