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COMMITTEE JURISDICTION AND OVERVIEW

The New York State Senate Standing Committee on Rules has wide discretion over bill review. The Committee on Rules may sit at any time and report bills out of committee which have been referred to Rules from any other Committee, including bills which may have been referenced to the committee upon introduction.

During the 2022 Legislative Session, 761 bills were referred to the Committee for its review. Of these bills, 759 were reported from the Committee, 743 were passed by the Senate, and 583 passed in both houses. This work was conducted through a series of 20 committee meetings. A list of all bills that were reported from the committee is provided at the end of this report.

TWO-HOUSE BILLS

In 2022, 583 of the 761 bills referred to the Standing Committee on Rules passed both houses of the Legislature. Of these bills, the Governor has signed 498 and vetoed 83. Two bills are still awaiting Executive action.
