

COMMITTEE JURISDICTION AND OVERVIEW

The New York State Senate Standing Committee on Transportation has legislative oversight responsibilities for issues concerning canals, highways, navigation, transportation authorities, railroads, rapid transit, aviation, and vehicle and traffic laws.

During the 2022 Legislative Session, 547 bills were referred to the Committee for its review. Of these bills, 148 were reported from the Committee. 97 were passed by the Senate, and 62 passed in both houses. This work was conducted through a series of eight committee meetings. A list of all bills that were reported from the committee is provided at the end of this report.

COMMITTEE HIGHLIGHTS

The following key bills were acted on by the committee in 2022:

- **S.3532A** (Kennedy) This bill legalizes the use of flashing green lights on snowplows. Green lights have been shown to be more visible to the human eye, so drivers can better see plows on the road.
- S.3897 (Kennedy) This bill expands the use of complete streets design elements in municipal road construction by increasing the reimbursement percentage a municipality receives if it uses a complete street element.
- S.2021A (May) This bill gives cities, villages and towns outside of New York
 City to set their speed limits lower, to 25 miles per hour. Lower speeds have
 been shown to lower pedestrian injury rates.
- S.9428 (Savino) This bill addresses the epidemic of catalytic converter theft by imposing restrictions on the purchase, sale and possession of catalytic converters by vehicle dismantlers, scrap processors and others.
- S.5602B (Gounardes) This bill expanded road safety measures by allowing New York City to operate its speed camera program 24 hours a day, seven days a week.
- S.3953B (Kennedy) This bill makes New York's freight rail operations safer by requiring the presence of at least two persons on each freight rail operating within the state.
- S.8822 (Kennedy) This bill expands the ability of police to issue tickets for individuals illegally parking in designated handicap spots at shopping centers and strip malls.
- S.3587C (Comrie) Tollpayer Protection Act
- S.5899A (Parker) requiring MTA to install surveillance cameras at subway platforms

TWO HOUSE BILLS

In 2022, 62 of the 632 bills referred to the Standing Committee on Transportation passed both houses of the Legislature. Of these bills, the Governor has signed 52, vetoed one, and nine are awaiting action by the Governor.
