COMMITTEE JURISDICTION AND OVERVIEW

The New York State Senate Standing Committee on Aging has legislative oversight responsibilities for issues concerning Elder Law, nursing homes, caregivers, and senior services. During the 2025 Legislative Session, 75 bills were referred to the Committee for its review. Of these bills, 31 were reported from the Committee. This work was conducted through a series of four Committee Meetings. A list of all bills that were reported from the Committee is provided at the end of this report.

Requires the division of housing and community renewal, with the state office for the aging, to establish a database of available senior housing; requires the office for the aging to maintain such database
