AREA STATE LEGISLATORS EARN NFIB'S "GUARDIAN OF SMALL BUSINESS" AWARD

JAMESTOWN, NY – New York State Senator George Borrello and Assemblyman Andy Goodell have each earned the “Guardian of Small Business” award from the National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB), the nation’s leading small business advocacy group.
