Dear Senator Stavisky:

I write respectfully requesting the Senate Higher Education Committee conduct a hearing concerning current practices for invitation of guest speakers on State University of New York (SUNY) campuses.

As you may know, Jalil Abdul Muntaqim - previously known as Anthony Bottom – was convicted in 1974 of two counts of first-degree murder of two brave members of the NYPD. He was recently invited to speak on the campus of SUNY Brockport on April 6<sup>th</sup>, 2022 following being paroled in 2020. While the President of SUNY Brockport – Heidi Macperson – maintains that they do not endorse his views while simultaneously stating that he should have a forum to discuss why he identifies himself as a "former political prisoner." It is extremely concerning that a taxpayer funded institution such as SUNY Brockport is giving this individual a platform to discuss his views and experiences without any context, and it opens other questions about what practices are being employed at other SUNY institutions with respect to guest speakers.

I have deep concerns regarding the possibility of convicted killers of police officers speaking on SUNY campuses not only as a State Senator but also as the mother of a SUNY student. I am a strong believer in our First Amendment and the right to freedom of speech, but I also believe there is a time and place for everything; I do not believe exposing our SUNY students to the views of a convicted murderer is a responsible use of State-funded resources. Accordingly, Madam Chair, I once again request that the Higher Education committee hold a hearing regarding current SUNY campus guest speaker policies.
