Dear Mr. Sullivan:

We are aware that staffing shortages at the hospitals of the Catholic Health System (CHS) have caused a devastating crisis for both patients and workers. CHS healthcare workers have told us of not having enough time to provide patients with the care they need, and that needed supplies are often unavailable. They report repeatedly working through lunch hours and breaks because they know there will not be adequate staff to watch patients while they are out. These healthcare heroes have been stretched past their breaking point, and felt that only a strike would force the recognition of these problems.

These healthcare heroes have been sacrificing their own health and well-being to get Buffalo through the COVID-19 pandemic. They have done everything possible to save lives and support families, despite deep staffing shortages, limited resources, and a hospital system that has not listened to their concerns until now.

The COVID-19 pandemic has shed a spotlight on just how essential and important our healthcare workers are. Catholic Health will only make a national healthcare worker shortage worse by failing to agree to a contract that values the dedication of our healthcare heroes. We urge Catholic Health to work expeditiously to negotiate a fair contract with these workers – one that will enable CHS to attract and retain the staff needed to guarantee the highest quality patient care.
