It needs to be disposed of properly and safely, and that is what our partners at Sunnking will help our community members do at this event. At this event, people can get rid of the old electronics that have been cluttering up their homes. Assemblyman Manktelow said, "There are many people who get stuck with these outdated or broken electronic items.
