The NYS Legislature

Small businesses, seniors, students and individuals with special needs were among the hardest hit by the effects of the pandemic. Together with my colleagues on the Senate Committees for NYC Education; Aging; Mental Health; Disabilities; and Social Services, I worked every day to provide the help and support they deserve.

As Chair of the Senate Administrative Regulations Review Commission, my work in the legislature this year included many battles against state of emergency policies enacted by executive power without legislative oversight.

Because children are our greatest resource, I fought incessantly to implement appropriate policies to reopen our schools and special education programs. To safeguard their health and protection, we strengthened the safety net for struggling families and I voted NO to legalizing marijuana.

I proposed legislation (Save Our Stores) to save small local businesses from the decimating effects of onerous policies and punitive enforcement because they are the backbone of our communities. We must continue to encourage New York's economic growth and to remove the regulatory barriers that stifle business and economic success.

I am very pleased that New York State is taking action to end the hateful BDS campaign and uphold our longstanding support of Israel, our closest ally in the Middle East. I applaud NYS Comptroller Di Napoli for his bold actions against the intolerant act by Ben & Jerry's and its parent company Unilever, which sows hate and encourages violence against Jewish people everywhere. New York State has sent a clear message that these bigoted actions will not be tolerated. I hope to hear that New York City will follow suit and do the right thing.

S614 - Allows caregiving visitors for residents of health care facilities during a state of emergency.



S1035 – Allows an essential support person to accompany an individual with disabilities during a hospital stay.

S6521 - Authorizes funeral homes and cemeteries to accept e-signatures to ease the process of these arrangements.




S.7230-Excludes all COVID-19 small business recovery grants from their taxable income.

S3941 – Expanded "Do Not Call" Registry restricts text messages as a form of telemarking.



S3223-Allows social service agencies to conduct interviews, screenings and assessments via telephone.



\$2836-HALT Solitary Confinement Act-Limits time spent in solitary confinement and aims to create better alternatives.



\$7192 – Authorizes school districts to help special education students who aged out during the pandemic by maintaining services until they turn 23.



S784 - SLEEP Act – Bans motorists and repair shops from illegally modifying car mufflers and exhausts to make them excessively loud, and increases penalties.



S7194 - Requires the State to set aside all monies awarded in opioid cases in a fund earmarked to support the prevention, treatment and recovery of substance use.



\$7133 - Camp Fees for Children on Public Assistance - Provides an allowance for summer camp.


