

"Porch Piracy" occurs when criminals steal packages from a porch or doorstep after their delivery. Porch Piracy is a growing crime affecting millions of Americans.



In 2017, **25.9 million Americans experienced package theft**, up from 23 million in 2015.

74% of packages are stolen from homes during the day when homeowners are at work and the average value of stolen packages is \$50-100.

53% of respondents said they have changed their plans to make sure they were home for a package despite not having to sign for it.

41% of respondents said they don't buy certain items online because they're afraid the packages will get stolen.

31% of respondents stated they had personally experienced package theft.

7% of all Americans have been victims of Porch Pirates.
