## RE: Extension of CUNY Credit Program for Puerto Rican and U.S. Virgin Island Evacuees

Dear City University of New York Board of Trustees.

We are writing to request that the City University of New York (CUNY) continue providing evacuees from Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands access to the in-state tuition credit program. Almost a year after Hurricanes Maria and Irma ravaged Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands, millions of Americans continue facing the dire consequences of the natural disaster and the shamefully inefficient and uncoordinated response from our federal government. Senator Rivera was pleased to learn at the Governor's New York Stands with Puerto Rico Rebuilding and Reconstructing Committee that the program is expected to be extended. We look forward to the official vote on June 25.

In Puerto Rico, families are struggling with an unreliable power grid, water sanitation, and closing schools as Puerto Ricans continue to flee the island to the mainland United States in search of better living conditions. Recently, it was revealed that as many as 4,645 Puerto Ricans have likely perished due to Hurricane Maria, either in the immediate aftermath of the storm or from the conditions generated following the wreckage of the island's health facilities. Considering the inaction from the federal government, it is critical that state governments continue to stand in solidarity to provide support to those citizens on the island as well as those who were evacuated who remain ignored and overlooked. This is especially true of New York State, since it hosts one of the largest Puerto Rican communities across the country.

Since Hurricane Maria, the Fiscal Control Board overseeing Puerto Rico's economy has imposed significant fiscal cuts to the island's budget including to its already financially challenged public university system. In addition, the Board decided to double the cost of tuition to make up for the expenses of the recovery efforts and to help counter Puerto Rico's extreme debt. The U.S. Virgin Island's fiscal shortages have also been stagnating recovery.

Therefore, we are writing to urge the City University of New York Board of Trustees to continue supporting those students from Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands who were displaced by these hurricanes, and vote to extend the in-state tuition credit program for the City University of New York for the 2018-2019 academic year. In that way, we are ensuring that these students continue pursuing their education without missing precious time in completing their academic degrees.

As CUNY's Board of Trustees votes today on a resolution to extend this critical program, we would like to express our sincere appreciation for to the work CUNY has done and continues to do in protecting and supporting our Puerto Rican and Virgin Islander brothers and sisters.
