Senator Bill Weber Announces Committee Assignments Will Serve as the Ranking Member on the Influential Budget and Revenue Committee

Senator Bill Weber (Republican, Conservative), who represents New York's 38th District, was appointed to the influential Budget and Revenue Committee and chosen as ranking member by the Republican Conference. Senator Weber is one of just two certified public accountants in the entire state legislature, an important qualification much in demand for this role.
