*Donna Bolner, Dutchess County Legislator and Chair of the Dutchess County Tick Task Force, said, "I want to thank Senator Serino for providing an opportunity to educate the public about ticks at the beginning of the fall clean up season. Too many times we forget that even though the weather may be cooler ticks are still out. Also, unfortunately tick borne disease may easily be thought to be the flu when symptoms begin to occur."*

Children ages five to nine have the highest incidences of Lyme Disease. Early detection of a tick is key and frequent tick checks play a critical role in keeping kids safe and healthy. Experts were on hand at the event to show parents and kids how to spot a tick on themselves and their pets, and to demonstrate proper removal techniques.
