## Written Testimony for hearing on Election and Voting Rights in New York State

Thank you for offering the public an opportunity to address Election concerns. New York has come a long way in updating and improving election law, but there is more we can do to assure that all eligible voters can and should vote easily.

1. Election Day a Public Holiday - I have been wanting to say this for years. Election Day should be a Public Holiday whether it be a state or federal holiday. What better way to to tell our citizens that elections are essential, that they are the cornerstone for a democracy to function as a voice of the people.

- -It would also be easier to recruit poll workers other than just retirees.

## 2. More and better trained Poll Workers -
